Music: A Vessel for the Sacred




# Adult Ed Offering: Critical Race Theory, Intersectionality, & Social Justice

Join us for discussion around *The Color of Wate*, by James McBride, a talented author, journalist & musician who debuted his inspiring memoir in 1996. He alternates chapters between his



story and the story of his mother, a white Jewish woman who fled an abusive father in the south. She lands in New York City and finds faith, love and community with a Black pastor and the church that he serves. McBride discovers that to understand who he is, he needs to understand the story of his often secretive mother. While this may be a familiar book to many, it is worth revisiting as we recognize Black History Month.


