Until a new finance person is on the ground, Liz will be wearing both her pastoral and finance hats, so please be patient and gracious as she juggles these two roles. In the meantime, Rev. Shevel and Rev. Shortlidge are also responsible for providing pastoral care, so there will not be any gaps in pastoral presence over these next few months of transition. Rev. Wagner will serve as our Bridge Associate Pastor until at least December 31, 2023. We're delighted to have her begin the transition into this new pastoral role.

Rev. Elizabeth (Liz) Wagner served as pastor at the First Presbyterian Church in Logan, Ohio and as the Associate Pastor at the Presbyterian Church of Bella Vista, Arkansas. Liz was a CPA in corporate accounting in Charlotte, North Carolina before being called to the ministry. She received her seminary training at Union Presbyterian Seminary at Charlotte and was enrolled in the Doctor of Ministry Program at Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary. Liz and her husband moved to Philadelphia a couple years ago when Jim accepted the position of Business Administrator for the Presbytery of Philadelphia. The Wagners live in Center City and are blessed to have the families of their two sons residing close by.






Monthly Contemplative Prayer Time




Black History Month Speaker Series - February 5, 12, 19
