

The presentation was recorded and is available on the Women's Ministry page under Events on the Church's website. What a gift to share in this experience as we navigate our fall theme, through the wilderness!








#### WPC BOOK CLUB For January

If we are really paying attention to what's happening within and around us, we will always be grieving something, and we will always be celebrating something. There is no moment in our lives when the notes of sorrow and joy do not sound together. What can be gained by tuning into this tension, and how might it lead us to the very heart of God? Catherine Ricketts will guide us through these questions with personal narrative and a study of sorrow and joy in the life of Christ. We'll then consider how the arts can uniquely help us to hold this tension, and we'll have the opportunity to respond during a memoir-writing workshop or visual art workshop.

Catherine Ricketts is a writer and musician whose work focuses on the arts, grief, joy, and spirituality. Her writing appears The Christian Century, The Kenyon Review Online, The Ploughshares Blog, Image Journal, and WXPN's The Key. In addition to her own creative practices, she's maintained a vibrant career nurturing the work of other artists at Philadelphia arts institutions, including WXPN, FringeArts, and the Philadelphia Museum of Art. 
