JUNE 2022





Three WPC members volunteered to chat with English as a Second Language (ESL) students at their Conversation Cafes in April. The ESL classes are one of the ministries that WPC's mission partner in Philadelphia directs. All three volunteers had the same reaction – each loved the experience, learned more about immigration and Philadelphia's diversity and each want to return in the fall to do it again. It was energizing, fun and enlightening!

One volunteer spoke with two ladies from Brazil who have only spoken Portuguese for the last three years while living in Philadelphia. Brazilians are the largest immigrant group in Philadelphia with over 40,000 Portuguese speakers. The ladies communicated that they work, live, and socialize with Portuguese speakers, so the conversation cafes are a good opportunity to practice their English.

Another volunteer chatted with a mother and daughter from the Ukraine who have been in Philadelphia for one month, living with the mother's sister. They had learned some English in Ukraine, but still rely on their phones to help with translation, as do all the students. Making their way from eastern Ukraine, prior to the US government allowing refugees to fly directly from Europe, was difficult to say the least. Their escape involved a train ride to Poland, a flight to Germany, and then another flight to Mexico where they made the US border crossing on foot in Tijuana before a final flight to Philadelphia. Thousands upon thousands of Russians, Ukrainians and immigrants from the "Stans" (Uzbekistan, Kyrgyzstan & Kazakhstan are represented in the ESL classes) live in Philadelphia. We prayed for their husband/father who remains in Ukraine.

The third volunteer spoke with a woman from China and another from Kazakhstan, one who was expecting a child and both who were interested in supporting and helping each other. They were very eager to improve their English so that they can pursue a career.

Overall, there was a nice camaraderie among the students in each class and a huge appreciation for the volunteers who came to speak English with them and help them in their conversation.

The Conversation Cafes will begin again in the fall, and you are welcome to join. The location is a few minutes from Lower Moreland.

Sheryl Durham, Faith in Action's outgoing Elder, gave a Moment for Mission at both worship services that detailed just a few of their accomplishments.

"I'd like to highlight the areas where their contributions were most deeply felt. It is challenging to pinpoint one area of their dedication and service, but I will attempt to do so nonetheless.

By initiating the establishment of the Social Justice Advocacy Ministry, George has been instrumental in bringing our attention to the needs of those in Southwest Philadelphia and beyond, and their respective challenges related to education, hunger, fair housing, and illegal firearms.

Ted's commitment to the Southwest Community Development Corporation included a regular presence in the communities, where he developed working relationships with residents, churches, and businesses. His efforts were most particularly realized in his revitalization of the Southwest Globe Times, for which he acted as publisher, reporter, and editor.

Since 1995, when our City Lights program was founded by Carey Davis, who is here with us today, Jane became dedicated to Mitchell School. She has tirelessly served on the front lines there through five principals, recruiting volunteers for tutoring, library support, and countless other needs that have arisen."
