Sunday Morning

Middle School Sunday School - 9:30am

6th and 7th graders will be meeting each Sunday in rooms 203 for their Sunday School classes. Over these two years they work their way through the whole Bible, touching on major people and events, seeing God's plan unfolding through history, and discussing what it means to them today.

Confirmation 9:30am

8th graders, and any other youth who want to join, we will be meeting for Confirmation in the Wayne Senior Center each Sunday through May. With their small groups they will be digging into some great theological concepts, asking some great questions, and deciding what they believe about God, faith, and the Church.

The Upper Room: High School Sunday School - 9:30am

9th - 12th graders will be meeting at the Gryphon Café on E. Lancaster Ave. Over a warm drink they will study Scripture, discuss its connection to their lives, and get to know one another.

In general, Sunday morning is a great time for your youth to come study the Bible, build a Christian community, and dig deeper into their faith.

Sunday Evening

Youth Group 6-8pm

On Sunday evenings our middle and high school youth group meet. The evening starts with dinner, where we all hang out and catch up with one another. Then most days we split into our different age groups. Our middle schoolers usually plays a game like human hungry-hungry hippos or live action clue, gets into a discussion on faith and their lives, and spends time in prayer for each other. Meanwhile our high school group does it's own parallel discussions, games, and prayer. Some nights though we spend most of the night in service, or prayer, or worship, or just fun.

In general, youth group focuses more on building relationships and support systems for our teens, and having discussions about their reality and where God is in the midst of it. These groups are great for people new to the church, wanting to learn more about God, who are wanting a group to be loved and encouraged by, or to have fun with. While everything we do in youth ministry is fun, because life's too short not to be fun, it is definitely more emphasized here than on Sunday morning.

Youth Choir

The Westminster choir is looking for musicians of all experience levels in grades 6-12. We rehearse from 5-6pm on Sunday evenings and sing in worship about twice a month, and have other retreats and choir tours

On Tuesdays all middle school youth are invited to the church for an afternoon of fun and relaxation. At the Chill we play games, grab a snack, play video games, and just hang out from 3-5:00pm.

On Tuesday evenings high school youth are invited to fun at the Hostetter house from 6-7:30pm. We eat together, play games, sit around a campfire, talk about life, and just have fun with our friends.
